PIAA POLICY



POLICY FOR DETERMINING NUMBER OF MEMBER SENIOR HIGH SCHOOLS SPONSORING A SPORT BEFORE PIAA BOARD OF DIRECTORS CONSIDERS ESTABLISHING OR DISCONTINUING AN INTER-DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIP IN THAT SPORT

The PIAA Board of Directors shall consider establishing or discontinuing an Inter-District Championship in a sport upon the number of member senior high schools sponsoring that sport reaching 100.

LACROSSE – JURISDICTION, ADOPTION, PITFALLS & CHAMPIONSHIPS



JURISDICTION

- Under PIAA jurisdiction since 1974...girls' only;
- Tremendous growth in late 1990's and early 2000's;
- Growth specific to boys.



ADOPTION

- Two Separate Occasions;
- Extremely geographic;
- Coincided with membership from Philadelphia Public & Catholic Leagues.



PITFALLS

- Again, extremely geographic in nature;
- Officials not registered with PIAA;
- Costs to Schools and Outside-In Approach.



CHAMPIONSHIPS

- Began effective with the first year of jurisdiction – July 1, 2008;
- Proportional Representation.

PIAA Emerging Sports Process Guide

The Emerging Sports program was created by the PIAA Board of Directors in 2021 based on an increase in the number of sport offerings outside of PIAA jurisdiction sponsored by or affiliated with PIAA member schools.

The purpose of this program is to provide emerging sport organizers a roadmap towards potential sponsorship by PIAA and indicate to member schools PIAA's awareness of such programs and support of additional interscholastic opportunities. Where an emerging sport continues to show meaningful interscholastic growth, consideration will be given by PIAA Board of Directors for full sponsorship.

PIAA policy provides the establishment or discontinuance of an Inter-District Championship in a sport upon the number of member senior high schools sponsoring that sport reaching 100. If a sport receives formal adoption after reaching this threshold, it will no longer be considered an emerging s an emerging sport is limited to a 10-year period to become a championship sport, un

Definitions of Terms:

Sport:

- a. Be defined as an athletic activity, sponsored at the varsity or club level, invo exertion for the purpose of competition against teams or individuals within an i competition structure.
- Operate under standardized rules with rating/scoring systems ratified by at least one official regulatory agency and/or governing body.

Emerging Sport:

- Meets the definition of a sport.
- b. Is accepted and recognized by PIAA as an emerging sport.
- c. Provides additional athletics opportunities to student-athletes and demonstrates PIAA's commitment to increasing athletic opportunities among student-athletes.

Varsity interscholastic sport: A varsity interscholastic sport is a sport that has been accorded that status by the PIAA member School Board of Directors or Board having jurisdiction over the member school and satisfies the following conditions:

- a. It is a sport that is sponsored by the school or controlled by the school Principal.
- b. It is a sport for which the eligibility of the student-athletes is reviewed and certified to by the Principal.

Varsity club sport: A club sport is a sport that has been accorded that status by the PIAA member School Board of Directors or Board having jurisdiction over the member school and satisfies the following conditions:

It is a sport that is sponsored by the school or controlled by the school Principal.





SanctionPA is a grassroots effort to work towards getting high school girls wrestling approved as a sanctioned sport in Pennsylvania through cooperation with local schools and The Pennsylvania interscholastic Athletic Association (PIAA). The SanctionPA campaign includes advocacy efforts, education resources, promotional materials, and collaboration with schools. The goal is for 100 PIAA-member schools in Pennsylvania to officially recognize and approve a girls wrestling program at the high school level and ultimately have the sport sanctioned at the state level.



Activities of the SanctionPA Initiative

- · Educate wrestling coaches and school administrators on girls wrestling:
- · Work with individual schools to form official high school girls wrestling teams;
- Provide resources to schools and coaches to develop girls teams;
- Work with the PIAA Wrestling Steering committee and state office on sanctioning efforts and the creation of a
 "AA State Championship;




HOW SANCTION PA HAS IMPACTED THE WRESTLING COMMUNITY



HOW SANCTION PA HAS IMPACTED THE WRESTLING COMMUNITY



- Created recruiting documents, campaign, and resources to support coaches in drawing in more girls to the sport;
- Created coaching guides to support male coaches if they had not coached girls before;
- Launched campaigns to bring more female coaches into the sport;
- Maintain communication with state association:
 - Inform SA about major initiatives;
 - Ask for guidance around responses to certain questions from schools and appropriate answers/language to use;
 - Keep them informed as schools form teams;
 - Maintain open dialogue and promote positive relationship when speaking to other stakeholders (i.e., try to dispel "us vs. them" mentality);
 - Ultimately both groups want the same thing for the development of a sport to be successful and sustainable.




CREATING AND MAINTAINING A RELATIONSHIP...
