



Let's Take a Look at the Numbers

- Difference 2018-2019 to 2020-2021:
 Known loss of **31,532** officials
 - Largest states of California, New York and Texas do not track officials' registration numbers; estimated loss of officials over 50,000
- Difference 2018-2019 to 2021-2022: Loss of 19,499
- Total number of officials registered in 2022-2023:

212,327 (+5% from 2021-22)

- Lack of professional hospitality
- Safety concerns

- Remuneration

- 1) Recruitment
- 2) Retention
- 3) Education



Recruitment Challenges

- Takes more than just stating the problem
- Prospective pools
- Identifying the barriers to getting involved
 - Costs
 - Requirements (i.e., testing, background checks)
 - Safety concerns
 - Confusion about how to sign up
 - The youth sports dilemma
 - Lack of game management (sportsmanship issues exacerbated)

Recruitment Opportunities

Can we reduce cost barriers?

- Working with Officials Associations to reduce initial membership fees
- Are there ways to reduce other initial entry fees? (e.g., background checks, testing fees)
- Is there a way to provide some type of financial assistance for equipment and apparel needs?





Recruitment Opportunities

Can we increase the prospective pool through incentives?

- Training programs being offered at the high school and collegiate level
- Get them started early
- Provide credit
- Great way to earn extra income for a young adult

Recruitment Opportunities

Can we market the opportunity better?

- Great way to stay involved in the sport
- Highlighting officials
- Recognition programs
- Operationalizing social media
- Create an easy call to action
 - Make the process easier!

Once We Get Them – How Do We Keep Them?

Why is retention just as important as recruitment?

- Why spend all this effort to recruit officials if we can't retain them?
- A survey by the National Association of Sports Officials reported that 80 percent quit after only two years of officiating
- Retention deserves equal attention and just as much effort as recruitment
- Upstream story



Retention Challenges

Addressing the Causes

- Spectator and Coach behavior
- Where in our society do we allow adults to treat other adults in this manner?
- This is an adult problem not a student-athlete problem
- We have tools and processes to manage student-athletes

Game Management

- Administration's role

 Until we can uniformly define and identify what poor sportsmanship is we will struggle to address it!
