Dear NFHS Hall of Fame Committee:

Please allow this letter to serve as a change of nomination category for Mrs. Elaine Elliott for consideration as a National High School Hall of Fame Inductee. Elaine was previously submitted under the Officials category, and I am requesting she be moved to the **Others** category for consideration.

As mentioned in the previously submitted recommendation letters, she has given tireless service to the State of South Carolina. Elaine is the founding President of the South Carolina Cheer Coaches Association (SCCCA). In that position, she was instrumental in getting Cheerleading accredited into the SC Athletic Coaches Association and the sport sanctioned by the South Carolina High School League (SCHSL).

Elaine spent 26+ years coaching the sport on various levels. She coached for five years at North High School, North, SC, 14 years at Lexington High School in Lexington, SC, and five years as the cheer coach and Cocky Advisor at the University of South Carolina. During her stint at Lexington, Elaine earned three consecutive State Titles (1991, 1992, 1993).

Elaine has 28 years of experience judging cheer on the local level which is her passion. She also judged national high school cheer competitions, All-Star, and collegiate Cheer Competitions with several cheer organizations in the United States. Included in those efforts are serving as a Disney World Collegiate and High School Cheer judge, National High School Invitationals Judge, and UCA Cheer Judge.

Elaine was inducted into the Lexington High School Hall of Fame (2022) and the South Carolina Athletics Coaches Association (SCACA) Hall of Fame (2022). In 2012, she received the SC Cheer Coaches Association Lifetime Achievement Award for her outstanding and dedicated contributions to cheerleading in the state of South Carolina. Elaine has also dedicated her time to the success in the sport of cheerleading nationally. Below please find just a few her major national accomplishments.

- Elected as an At-Large Representative of the Board of the American Association of Cheer Coaches and Administrators (AACCA) (1989). This election took place at the Coach's Conference sponsored by UCA in New Orleans in 1988.
- National Federation of Interscholastic Spirit Association (NFHS Contributor Award Section III, 2000)
- Who's Who of College Cheer Coaches (1998)
- Founding member of the Cheerleading Forum of America (CFOA). This national group was organized in November 1989 by representatives from each State Cheer Organizations, Cheer businesses (UCA, NCA and ICF, etc) and the National Federation of High Schools (Susan True). CFOA was created in an effort to bring the State Cheer Organizations, the Cheer Businesses and the National Federation together for the betterment of cheerleading across the country. The CFOA allows the entities to share ideas at the yearly meeting and take the ideas back to each state organization. While serving as President of the SCCCA, CFOA hosted its conference in Charleston, SC.

- Served as a NFHS State Spirit Director in the 1990s. This group was established by the NFHS to help develop Educational Workshops and Courses for Cheer Coaches across the nation. Her time as Director was served under the tutelage of Susan True who was at the head of NFHS Spirit at the time. With representatives from at least 46 states, the group would meet prior to NFHS Rules Interpreter's summer meeting. The sessions were used to develop the Coaches Principles Course for Cheer, a Coaching Philosophy and Spirit Program Management. The responsibilities of the group also included sharing the information learned with the state. Elaine also held workshops training coaches for at least three years.
- Certified as an AACCA Safety Instructor for SC in 1991 and held on-site safety certification workshops until AACCA merged with USA Cheer in 2019. **Note:** AACCA is no longer the Safety Certification program for Cheer Coaches. Elaine held her last on-site workshop at the SCACA Coach's Clinic in July, 2019. Coaches now receive Safety Certification through the USACheer and Dance Safety Awareness Course that can be found on-line at NFHSlern.com
- Has served as the SCHSL Arbiter Director for Cheer,

As you can see from her accolades listed above and her notable accomplishments listed in her previous nominations/recommendations, Elaine Elliott has all the qualifications for induction into the National High School Hall of Fame.

Elaine Elliott is enjoying her 30th year as a South Carolina High School League safety official for Competitive Cheer. How befitting, as she is the biggest cheerleader for student-athletes across South Carolina and the nation! Her passion for education and athletics started at a young age in which she participated in many school and community organizations to then become a cheer coach during her first teaching stint right out of college. She coached an award-winning cheer squad at Lexington High for several years before finding yet another passion in the cheer world-OFFICIATING! She developed a passion and respect for the young women and men who compete at this level and was a pioneer across the state, region for 'cheerleading' to be considered a sport. Not just as a SCHSL sanctioned sport, but in the minds of the public. Elaine believes female dominated sports such as cheer tend to be misconstrued and misplaced in a category of "not a REAL sport." She has changed the minds of many once she has convinced them to attend a competition or even a practice.

Elaine is the founding President of the South Carolina Cheer Coaches Association, serving as President for ten years. She presently serves on its Executive Board. She is also a charter member of the Cheer Forum of America, a national organization for Cheer Coaches and Cheer Associations.

Elaine was instrumental, as President of the SCCCA, in having Cheerleading accepted into the SC Athletic Coaches Association and being brought into the SCHSL as a sanctioned sport in SC. She personally met with the Athletic Directors for five years at the South Carolina Athletic Coaches Association Summer Clinic explaining why Cheer Coaches should be a part of that organization. During the 5th year of the SCACA's Summer Clinic, she and Keith Richardson sat down and drew up a contract that brought Cheer into that organization as an auxiliary group. Within a few years Elaine, who had been working closely with Patsy Mack at the SCHSL and the SCCCA Executive Board, met with Pete Ayube, Commissioner of the SCHSL and arranged for Cheer to become a sport governed by that organization. Thus, beginning a long tradition of SCHSL Sanctioned Cheer Competitions and State Cheer Championships in SC.

Elaine has been a Safety Judge for SC State Cheer Competitions since 1994. When she left high school coaching, she was determined to find a way to stay involved. That is when her journey as an official judge for SC High School Competitive Cheer began.

Elaine has 27 years' experience judging cheer on the local level which is her passion. She also judged national high school cheer competitions, All-Star and collegiate Cheer Competitions with several cheer organizations in the United States. In 2015 she decided to give her full attention to judging in South Carolina and devote all her time to SC Cheerleading. Elaine has found that being an official for Cheer in SC keeps her involved with the sport she truly loves.

She works in the off season to help improve Cheer as both a competitive sport and a support team endeavor. Until the 2020 merger with USA Cheer Safety and Risk Management, Elaine was the AACCA Safety Instructor for Cheer Coaches in South Carolina, a position she held since 1991. Safety Certification is now an online testing certification and there is no longer a need for on-site workshops which is what Elaine handled in SC.

As the SCHSL Arbiter Director for Cheer since 2015, she oversees assignments for all Cheer Officials to Sanctioned SCHSL Cheer Competitions. Before working with Arbiter, Elaine assigned judges for all high school events through the SCCCA. She did this as part of her position as Past-President on the Executive Board of the SCCCA. Elaine was on the committee formed by the SCCCA that developed the first scales and scoresheets for Cheer Competitions in SC.

Over the years, she has witnessed this sport grow into one of the most competitive, captivating sports in the state and across the USA. Elaine has perfected the ability to separate herself from the task at hand. She goes team blind during competitions, meaning she sees no team colors, mascots, names, or classifications. All she sees is SAFETY. She is known as the safety guru of cheer. Elaine takes this job very seriously as she has witnessed serious accidents and injuries over the years when rules were not followed properly. Don't let the hair bows and rhinestones fool ya. These student-athletes stand on the shoulders of pioneers such as Elaine Elliott, an official on a mission to continue safety measures while growing the sport of CHEER.




