




- Found NCAA was profiting from NIL of amatuer athletes
- Athletes have the right to compensation for their NIL

KONGiQ signing 70-plus high school players to endorsement deals at one of the top programs in the country could open the floodgates to something much bigger.



- Adult Entertainment, Alcohol, Tobacco, Cannabis, Controlled Substances,
 Prescription Pharmaceuticals, Casinos and Gambling, Weapons are prohibited
- Coaches and School Administration are prohibited to appear, promote, or assist
- Use of School name, logo, and/or mascot prohibited (includes highlight footage)
- Use of an agent is permitted
- Can be on any media (social media, TV, internet, print, etc.)
- Permitted to start own business
- Permitted to run camps, clinics, lessons (cannot be on their school grounds)
- Case by case discipline for infractions warning to suspension of eligibility
- No, no one associated with or acting at the direction of a member school, such as booster clubs, alumni, or collectives, may use the promise of NIL opportunities to entice student-athletes to transfer to or attend their school or offer NIL opportunities to student-athletes currently attending the member school.
