## High School vs. Collegiate NIL

- Collegiate NIL is driven by collectives. (75% of all NIL deals come through collectives and collectives can now offer SA's contracts that require them to enroll in a specific university)
- Collectives & Clubs, for the most part, are not allowed at the high school level.
- (Collectives do not keep NIL separate from a school's athletic department, so it would be a violation in 99% of states)
- Collegiate NIL is actively being used by a large percentage of athletes at the collegiate level.
   (Utilized predominantly in roster management - recruiting & retention)



# High School vs. Collegiate NIL

 The percentages of high school student-athletes with NIL deals is very small in comparison to overall participation rates. (stories of high school students now signing with collectives and being paid their final 1-2 years of high school - which would be a violation)

- Decisions made by collegiate athletes are being made with money being the central focus of those decisions.
- Decisions being made by the majority of high school athletes are more about student-athlete experiences and the specific value that they create.



# **Education: Understand Your State Policies**

- 28,000 high schools in the United States that could have 28,000 different ways to report and handle NIL deals.
- Education based institutions (educational based athletics) –
   First and foremost Do what we do best EDUCATE!
- Be compliant with your state association but not overzealous gathering information you don't need or can't have.
- Violations: It doesn't matter until it matters. Educate, educate, educate.



## **Education: Understand Your State Policies**

- Ability to make money away from your school is much more difficult with team sport athletes rather than individual.
- Last year .02% of eligible students in the GA had an NIL deal. This year .01% of eligible student have deals.
- This is not the end of the traditional high school athletic experience for 99.9% of those participating.
- Biggest issue across the country is a lack of consistent regulations
   Focus on your states policy –
   What does my policy look like in practice?

### **GHSA NIL GUIDELINES OVERVIEW**

A student-athlete may benefit from the use of their Name, Image, and Likeness (NIL) in compliance with GHSA by-law 1.92 PROVIDED:

#### Compensation IS NOT contingent on specific athletic performance or achievement.



Student-Athletes CANNOT be compensated for athletic participation or achievement! (achieving all state honors, scoring points / touchdowns / goals, being on a specific team, etc.)

#### Compensation IS NOT provided as an enrollment or retention inducement.



NIL activity compensation CANNOT be provided as an incentive to enroll or remain at a specific school!

#### Compensation IS NOT provided by the school or any person acting as an agent for the school.



NIL activity compensation CANNOT be provided by the school, school personnel, or individuals that are considered an extension of the school / acting on behalf of the school.

Whether or not a "booster" would qualify as an "agent" of the school will be up for interpretation, and something that would always require a call to the GHSA office to confirm.

# Can School Logos / Marks be used?











Intellectual property including, but not limited to, school logos, school name, school mascot, or any trademarked GHSA logo or acronyms may not be utilized for any student-athlete NIL activities.

## Can School Apparel be worn?












Intellectual property including, but not limited to, school logos, school name, school mascot, or any trademarked GHSA logo or acronyms may not be utilized for any student-athlete NIL activities.

#### Can School Facilities be used?









GHSA member school facilities may NOT be used for the purpose of name, image, and likeness activities.

### What about local School Policies?









Activities in conflict with a member school's local school district policy may NOT be endorsed through NIL activities. Examples may include: tobacco & alcohol products, controlled substances, etc.

## What about professional advisors?









Students and their families should seek professional guidance as to how NIL activities could impact collegiate financial aid and/or tax implications, among other issues.

## Is there a notification requirement?









Within (7) calendar days after entering into any type of NIL contract/agreement, a student or their parents/guardians must notify the Principal or Athletic Director of the student's school of entering into that agreement.

# Education: Understand Your State Policies GEORGIA




No student-athlete may be a member of nor receive compensation or any other benefit from a Collective or NIL Club.

Booster Clubs are not considered Collectives or NIL Clubs if such Booster Club is operated under the supervision of a member school and provides monetary or other benefits to school athletic facilities, school athletic equipment, school team meals or other school team benefits rather than to an individual student athlete or group of student athletes.


#### California – Nevada – Missouri – Illinois – Maryland – Virginia – Georgia - Florida



- All allow high school NIL for both private and public schools.
- In Maryland Privates are affiliate members of their state association.
- In Virginia Privates are members of the VISAA.
- All follow the policies of no school logo, uniform, or facility use.


- Illinois Specifies that a student may not engage in NIL activity while traveling to or from an association event.
- California Any appearances by students for nonprofit organizations must be approved by the Board of Trustees

- Florida Universal school choice
- Maryland Private schools are eligible to do whatever they like if they do not wish to play public schools.
- Missouri In-state school commitment requirement prior to NIL deals.






# **Know Your District/School**

• Areas where there are more businesses as opposed to areas with less = more possible opportunities.

- Schools with a more transient population could see fewer opportunities. If a student is likely to leave, a business may be less likely to offer a deal.
- If schools are located near more small business as opposed to larger corporate entities, it could alter what opportunities they may receive.







# Know Your District/School

•Schools with a religious affiliation could prevent opportunities based on certain opinions of the sponsor business.



## **Know Your Communities**

•Are they more blue- or white-collar communities.

 Do they have access to legal representation?



# NIL Clubs/Marketplaces

Know what you states stance is on "NIL Clubs."

•Be aware of NIL "marketplaces" that could be a violation to your states policy.

## The Future of High School NIL

 The courts are siding with the athlete's right to monetize their name image and likeness.

 OL Spencer Dowland was committed to Auburn for over a year, but they exceeded their 85-man limit and offered him a collective scholarship.

He wanted the security of a full scholarship, so he flipped

to Mississippi State.



## The Future of High School NIL



Defensive back Daniel Okonkwo flipped from Northern Illinois to Georgia.

Okonkwo had a full scholarship to NIU but choose to take a collective scholarship to play at Georgia.

## Signing Day - the NLI is going away but not the signing of financial aid agreements.





Did NIL compensation play a role in the selection of your commitment?











If you have been offered NIL money, were you provided a contract to review/sign?

## The Future of High School NIL

- Lawsuits
- Concerns with lack of understanding of regulations.
- Changing of State Policies Additions/etc.
- Comparing College NIL and High School NIL.
- Integration into the "Club Scene."
- Impact on Recruiting for Top Tier (D1) Athletes.



## Implications for Stakeholders

<u>Athletes</u>: They must carefully balance academics, athletics, and NIL pursuits while staying compliant with rules.

<u>Schools</u>: Administrators need to develop clear policies and educate students on NIL boundaries.

<u>Coaches</u>: Play a key role in mentoring athletes to make informed decisions without compromising team dynamics.

Parents and Guardians: Must stay involved, particularly in evaluating the legality and ethicality of NIL deals.

#### **Proactive Steps for Navigating NIL at the High School Level**

- <u>Education</u>: Schools and associations should offer workshops on NIL regulations and financial literacy.
- <u>Clear Policies</u>: Develop transparent, state-aligned NIL policies that outline what is and isn't permissible.
- Legal and Financial Guidance: Encourage families to consult professionals for contract and tax advice.
- Monitoring and Support: Establish systems to ensure athletes' NIL activities align with educational and athletic commitments.
